Mr. Henry Ollie West, age 84, of Shelbyville, passed away Monday, October 5, 2015. Funeral services will be 2 PM Wednesday, October 7, 2015, at Feldhaus Memorial Chapel. Reverend Jack Carney will officiate, with burial to follow in Willow Mount Cemetery.

The family will receive visitors 12 noon until service time Wednesday at the funeral home. He was born December 23, 1930, in Bedford County, to the late Clarence and Gertrude Lovell West. He was retired from the United States Post Office, and a former member of the Tennessee National Guard.
